Background

- Examples of policy use are needed to promote the understanding, implementation and increased use of environmental and ecosystem accounts
- Relatively few examples and those available are from the perspective of account producers (“information push”)
- Need to better understand decision-makers and policy analysis needs to generate greater demand (“policy pull”)

Recent publications on account uses

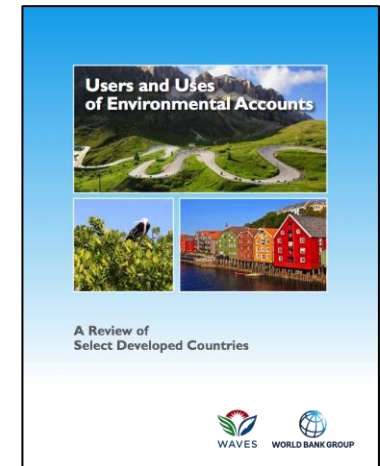
Smith (2014)

- Developed country focus (Australia, Canada, Sweden, etc.)
- Country by country

SEEA – Applications and Extensions

- By types of uses (intensity indicators, analysis, modelling, etc.)

Both used material collected from the account producers

Three stakeholder groups

Head (2008)

- Systematic research (science, economics)
- Program management experience (public service)
- Political judgement

Each has their own knowledge and experience and hence “multiple sets of evidence that inform and influence policy rather than determine it”

Different uses of information

Hezri and Dovers (2006)

- Instrumental: direct link exists between information and an actual decision.
- Conceptual: information sensitizes users to new problems and perspectives, but cannot be linked to specific policy decisions *per se*.
- Tactical: information are used as a delaying tactic, substitute for decision or actions, or to deflect criticism.
- Symbolic: information is used as an assurance that something is being done.
- Political: information is used to support predetermined positions or arguments.

New materials and process for policy engagement

- Need to move beyond identifying issues at the start to an on-going interaction
- Need to be able to connect with policy makers in terms that they are familiar
- Policy makers do not do training!
- Policy briefings – presenting the material we have in contexts which they are familiar to generate thoughts and discussion
- Policy roundtables
