






Key Issues for Rwanda

- Rwanda one of the most densely populated African countries;
- The country has few natural resources to exploit;
- Population largely rely on small, semi-subsistence rain-fed agriculture;
- Land already a constraint : land scarcity, plot fragmentation, land degradation, etc.

Water resources under pressure from high population growth & rapid economic development





Uses of NCA

- Rwanda started implementing NCA from early 2015;
- NCA discussed and provides inputs to the National Strategy for Transformation;





- NCA supports delivery of environmental-economic indicators and national M&E (inputs to the ENR SSP);
- NCA used to improve data quality and consistency;
- NCA supports economic assessments and policy analysis.



Uses of Land Accounts

- National Strategy focuses on land use allocation for development;
- Results from the Land Accounts informs the Land Use Master Plan;
- Results used to update LAIS template;
- Land Accounts inputs to IBES in NISR;
- Indicators from Land Accounts discussed and aligned with ENR Sector targets;
- Results from LA used for Policy briefs on Land Use and Land Cover change







Uses of Water Accounts

- National Strategy has target to reach 100 % coverage rate for water supply and sanitation services;
- Preliminary results considered in the review of Water Master Plan;
- Indicators from Water Accounts discussed and aligned with ENR Sector targets;
- Results from WA used to produce Policy briefs on Water Stress, Water use efficiency and productivity and Renewable water and Water scarcity









Rwanda Public Environmental Expenditures

- Committed to green the economy
- One of 1st countries to ban plastic bags;
- From 2004-13 Rwanda' spending on environment and climate change grew from 0.4 to 2.5 % of national budget;
- National Climate & Environment Fund (FONERWA) set up in 2012 for public & private, green & resilient projects;
- Investments in environmentally sustainable agriculture practices in all 30 districts;
- EIA institutionalized for all sectors.

NCA can Inform Public Environmental Expenditure

- NCA results will help identify priority areas for investment and inform resourcing and management decisions;
- NCA data will help balancing the trade-off (food security, land degradation, biodiversity conservation, etc.);

NCA will provide baseline to monitor losses and gains with

natural resources over time;

 NCA data will highlight links between economic activity and pressures on natural capital
